



Who isn't a pokie trust? Finding alternative funding options in NZ

Be proud of not using pokie funding — use it as a marketing tool.

Fundraising can be an arduous task and often it can seem easy to take the short route and apply for funding through the pokie trusts. But it should be remembered that the funding comes out of the pocket of families who can least afford it. Pokie venues are set up in areas where people have little money and taking money from the trusts is paramount to taking it directly from the pockets of the families of problem gamblers.

To empower you to seek funding elsewhere this fact sheet has a list of organisations and web pages within NZ which are designed to locate all kinds of funding for organisations and individuals from sponsorship to grants. Remember most local councils provide funding to community organisations.

There are also organisations which supply support in forms other than money, such as NZ Post—cheaper postal rates, The Ark in Auckland—secondhand computing equipment, other places may supply free photocopying, shared working premises to reduce rent or assistance from local councils who may have facilities available, chartered accountants who work for free for community groups, and staff training—MOH assists through Community Education Centres. There are many more if you search around who will support or help a good cause.

Fundraising is not just about filling out forms it is about friend raising as well.
