



The PGF library 3 years on

The brief to establish library stated:

- The library's collection must be seen to reflect the needs and objectives of its parent body. The collection development policy should be placed in the context of the library's mission and that of the wider organisation.
- The PGF library supports the PGF mission by informing and empowering the public and communities through the provision of material on gambling, counselling, advocacy and policy changes.
- The objectives of the library are to provide information on gambling to the media, libraries, resources centres, community organisations and the public. To proactively seek information on gambling and disseminate it as widely as possible.
- The contractual fulfillments for the library are to set up an information centre and clearing house. A library and internet service will be set up with an appropriately qualified person maintaining and cataloguing publications. The library is to provide space for study and the provision of catalogued books and materials. The librarian is to collect relevant material and maintain a forwarding service to problem gambling service providers and to purchase subscriptions to international libraries.
